This work is found in various levels of treatment to the plates: some are fully hand-colored, some are partially colored (as in this copy), and some are not colored at all.

Captain Thomas Brown, FRSE FLS, was a British naturalist and malacologist. elected a Fellow of the Royal Society of Edinburgh in 1818. Twenty-two years later he was appointed curator of the Manchester Museum (1840), where he served for another twenty-two years. Brown wrote several natural history books, including a few on conchology. He was a Fellow of the Linnean Society, a member of the Wernerian, Kirwanian and Phrenological Societies, and President of the Physical Society.

Jonas David Labram (born Labran) was a Swiss botanical illustrator and naturalist. He also made entomological illustrations. He discovered several new plants in the Basel region that were included in Carl Friedrich Hagenbach's (1771–1849) flora of the region. The Labran family were known for their involvement in the cloth industry in Neuchâtel.




Lieure made a name for himself in the field of collecting prints, compiling a collection of Callot, thus for printmaking he is deemed "a true apostle of engraving", according to the newspaper *L'Amateur d'estampes*. He animated the small world of amateurs by participating in learned societies, promoting the practice, giving conferences, etc. Also a collector, he surrounded himself with several collections of prints: one of the work of Jacques Callot (1,370 pieces), which he sold to the Museum of Fine Arts in the city of Nancy in 1940.





Emil Ludwig was a German-Swiss author, though born in Breslau (now part of Poland), known for his biographies and study of historical "greats." In 1906, he moved to Switzerland, but, during World War I, he worked as a foreign correspondent for the Berliner Tageblatt in Vienna and Istanbul. He became a Swiss citizen in 1932, later emigrating to the United States in 1940.


"When A Noel Mobbs and F McDermott wrote their book Curling in Switzerland, published by Arrowsmith in 1929, they listed 37 resorts in that country which had facilities for curling. One of these was Villars, which had two clubs. The Villars Curling Club had an average of 33 members, including ten ladies. The Villars Chalateer Club had an average of 13 members, including two ladies. The authors also write, "At any resort where there is curling a lady will usually find little difficulty in getting some instruction in the game, even though the remainder of the players are all men. Some ladies, however, may prefer to go to a resort where they will be fairly certain to find other members of their sex on the rink. Centres which are likely to fulfil this requirement are St Moritz, Davos, Murren, Grindelwald, VILLARS, Celerina, Maloja, and Wengen." – The women curlers who first took to the ice in Switzerland. (2019).

Sir Arthur Noel Mobbs KCVO OBE was the founder of Slough Estates, one of the United Kingdom's largest property businesses. Mobbs was also keen to establish sporting and social facilities for the people of Slough and in 1928 he bought Stoke Park Golf Club for £30,000 and reformed it.

First edition. An important book, believed to be the first on the history and art of American tattooing. Tattoos were mostly worn by sailors, criminals, and prostitutes when this work first appeared in 1933. Albert Parry was the author of the landmark 1933 book called, *Tattoo, Secrets of a Strange Art as Practised by the Natives of the United States*. Parry's book caused a sensation when it was published and many reviews and excerpts were printed in magazines such as *Esquire, American Mercury, Modern Mechanic* and *Scientific American*. Most of these reviews focused on the startling revelation that tattooing and sex were connected. Parry went to waterfront tattoo parlors, circus midways, and other shady sites to interview some of the great tattoo artists of the day. Now legendary tattooists such as Charlie Wagner and Albert "Lew the Jew" Kurzman shared information about their techniques with Parry. Contains much historical research as well. There is a valuable chapter on the removal of tattoo marks.

"Parry, writing in 1933, was one of the first devotes of Freud, and was Freudian terminology to tattooing He interviewed a vast number of tattooists then alive, and like many journalists, accepted the tales they told him without any attempt at verification. His book so infuriated the few tattoo artists literate enough to read it and understand what he was saying that one and all denounced him for doing their art a great disservice. The publishing house was founded in 1808 by Giovanni Ricordi in partnership with Felice Festa to create a music printing house. This company lasted only a few months but Giovanni Ricordi, although he was left alone, managed to expand the publishing activity by acquiring numerous theatrical archives, including that of La Scala, which allowed him to print in 1825 the first catalog of the published works. Also in those years, the Lithograph Ricordi had been activated in Milan and two branches had been

opened in Florence and London. Under the direction of his son Tito, the number of branches increased and the publishing house became increasingly important in the Italian music publishing scene.







